Dear Ian Byrd

Allow me to introduce myself and the institution I'm working in.

I am Luca Bösch, a software engineer and educator. I'm working at the Bern University of Applied Sciences (https://www.bfh.ch/en), for the Department for Higher Education Didactics & E-Learning. We do support the faculty in their teaching. To bring forward the quality of learning is our big goal. Recently we stumbled upon your great "The Differentiator" (https://byrdseed.com/differentiator) tool which we find very useful. In fact, providing good teaching goals using the appropriate taxonomy is one of the fundamentals of good education.

So, the idea came up: "Would it be possible to interconnect the differentiator's functionality with our learning management system in use?"

In fact, we do use Moodle as our strategic learning management system: I myself am one of the contributors of Moodle and I am very active in the actual development of this non profit open source project, providing bug fixes and improvements on a regular basis and also maintaining a plugin, too.

I think it would be possible to create "The Differentiator" as a plugin for Moodle, in which educators then could formulate/create their learning goals, having the chance to save them then for later use.
What you could benefit, then, is

- a broader knowledge of your tool, made available to much more educators inside their everyday used learning management system (backlink to the original https://byrdseed.com/differentiator/ provided, of course)
- potentially dozens of new language versions. The Moodle plugins are translated by a global community of voluntaries. They do this perserving the
 original open source licence so you are entitled to go and grab all those translations and embrace them for use in your original page, of course.

It would be myself in charge of first the programming and then the maintenance of that plugin. No costs come up to you. You do not commit yourself to anything giving me a possibility to have a glance at your sources. I do not gain any profit by such project and act fully in the spirit of the CC-BY-SA license and would share my sources created on such a project. If you wish I could report back to you on a regular basis during the development of such a Moodle plugin.

What do you think of this idea, lan?


